## **I GENERAL REGULATIONS**

### **1. Organisation and Terminology**

In according with decisions of the IIA Congress and on the basis of the Statutes and Official Indiacca Rules of the IIA

**World Championships in Indiacca for Men, Women, Mixed teams and Seniors** take place every four year.

### **2. Right to participate**

All National Federations affiliated to the IIA are admitted to the World Championships, provided that their financial obligations to IIA are fulfilled.

The WCh for men, women and mixed teams will take normally place on same dates and in same venues. They may be organised as different events if special situations should occur.

### **3. Allocation and dates of the Competitions**

The NFs will receive the official Application Forms three years prior to the competitions. The EC-IIA selects the most suitable candidate after a thorough examination of the applicants. The choice and the decision will be presented to the NFs two years prior to the event.

The dates are set by EC-IIA in collaboration with the TC-IIA and OC.

### **4. Conditions for participation. Age**

Number of teams per NF, number of players per team and ages are as follows:

<b>Team per NF</b>	<b>Players per team</b>	<b>Age</b>
1 Men	10 players	no age limit
1 Women	10 players	no age limit
1 Mixed	10 players	no age limit
1 Men Senior	10 players	40 or more years
1 Women Senior	10 players	40 or more years
1 Mixed Senior	10 players	40 or more years

Men, Women and Mixed Senior players have the right to participate if they reach the determined age during the year of the competition.

It is only possible to participate in one age category.

One player can take part in two disciplines, either in Men and Mixed or in Women and Mixed.

## 5. Size of delegation

Maximum size of a delegation is as follows:

**Each delegation must bring at least one own referee with the IIA certificate at the WCh`s disposal.**

**The number of the referees will depend of the numbers of the teams of each federation as following:**

**1-2 teams: at least 1 referee**

**3-4 teams: at least 2 referees**

**5-6 teams: at least 3 referees**

**The referees must be free, that means, that they don`t play in a team at the competition-day.**

## 6. Entry fee

The entry fee is **150.- EURO** per one team.

## 7. Entry registration

7.1 For registration of entry, official forms which are distributed to all affiliated NF by the IIA General Secretariat at the required time are to be used.

7.2 The deadline for arrival at the General secretariat are determined by the dates of the competitions, as follows:

### 7.2.1 Provisional registration

- **5 months** before the dates of the WCh

### 7.2.2 Definitive registration of delegation members and nominative registration of referees

- **3 month** before the dates of the WCh

The entry fee has to be paid when sending the definitive registration

### 7.2.3 Nominative list of players and officials

- **1 month** before the date of the WCh

## 7.3 Alternations of the nominative lists of the players

Alternations of the nominative lists are possible only in exceptional cases and must be authorised by the President of the TC concerned.

Alternations will not be accepted later than 24 hours prior to the start of the competition unless the work-plan states otherwise.

7.4 All participants are provided with identity-cards by the OC.

## **II TECHNICAL ORGANISATION**

### **8. Competitions` Format**

The WCh consist of the following competitions:

8.1 Men, Women and Mixed teams (see p. 4)

8.2 Men, Women and Mixed teams for 40 and more years (see p. 4)

### **9. System of the Competitions**

It will be decided after the definitive forms will be received.

### **10. Duration and time-schedule**

The WCh is normally organised during 3 days as follows:

Day 1: Qualification games for Senior Men, Women and Mixed teams

Day 2: Qualification games for Men, Women and Mixed teams

Day 3: Finals for Senior teams, and for Men, Women and Mixed teams

### **11. Technical Tasks**

11.1 The TC-IIA is responsible for the technical organisation and running of the competitions. They may appoint other persons or commissions to take care of special tasks.

11.2 Organisation, accomplishment and direction of the competitions complies with the Official Indica Rules and Regulations for World Championships.

### **12. Refereeing Corps**

12.1 All referees must be holders of the IIA licence for the corresponding cycle.

12.2 Each participating NF has the right to nominate referees fulfilling the requirements (see p.12.1). The appointment of the referees to each game is made by TC-IIA.

12.3 All referees have to participate in the judges course prior to the competitions (see p.7.2.2 of these regulations).

12.4 Qualifications of the referees` are stated in the Official Indica Rules.

12.5 The TC will take the necessary decisions if extraordinary and unforeseen situations should occur.

### **III RANKING**

#### **13. Champion Title**

- 13.1 The winner team of the WCh is awarded with the title “World Champion in Indiacas Men/Women/Mixed Team”.
- 13.2 The winner for Senior team of the WCh is awarded with the title “Senior World Champion in Indiacas Men/Women/Mixed Team”.

#### **14. Medals**

Awards are presented as follows:

- 1. place: one gold medal and one diploma for each player and one coaches
- 2. place: one silver medal and one diploma for each player and one coaches
- 3. place: one bronze medal and one diploma for each player and one coaches

#### **15. Diplomas**

- 15.1 The players and one coaches of each 3 highest ranked team are awarded a diploma containing forename, surname, NF and ranking.
- 15.2 All other competitors, members of delegations, present members of the IIA-Authorities, the referees as well as members of the technical staff receive a souvenir diploma containing forename, surname, NF and the individual function.

#### **16. Score Sheets, Ranking Lists**

- 16.1 The OC is obliged to distribute intermediate results during the competitions to the representatives of the IIA, press, radio, television and heads of delegations.
- 16.2 All parties mentioned above shall receive a copy of the complete results when the competition is completed.

### **IV FUNCTIONS OF THE ORGANISING COMMITTEE**

#### **17. Responsibilities of the Organiser**

- 17.1 The NF appointed by the IIA as organiser of the WCh is fully responsible for the organisation of the event and for establishing the local OC. They carry out all the necessary practical work and cover the related expenses.

## 17.2 General obligations of the OC

The OC is responsible for a flawless running of the event, which includes the running of the competitions, the training sessions, the referees course and the necessary meetings.

To achieve this, the OC must strictly observe the

- WCh Regulations of the IIA
- Contract between IIA and the organising NF
- Directions including in the contract
- Decided agreements between OC and TC-IIA

## V FINANCIAL MATTERS AND OBLIGATIONS

### 18. Financial Obligations

The organiser will cover all the expenses and obligations related to the running of the event, including the financial agreement defined in the contract between IIA and the responsible NF.

## VI SPECIAL REGULATIONS

### 19. Special Regulation

19.1 The rules of the Statutes of the IIA and the Official Indica Rules of the IIA will be applied in all situations which are not foreseen in these Regulations.

If extraordinary situations should occur the necessary decisions will be made by the President of the TC concerned, in collaboration with the members of the TC and EC-IIA present at the competitions.

19.2 All documents and information concerning the WCh are published in English. If necessary the language of the organising country can be used.

19.3 EC-IIA in collaboration with the TC-IIA has the right to make necessary modifications of the Official Indica Rules in order to improve the organisation and practical running of the WCh.

The original regulations were approved by General Assembly of IIA on 9<sup>th</sup> of August 2006 in Viljandi / Estonia.

The present regulation will be valid from **9<sup>th</sup> of August 2006**.
